Use only with equipment cleaned for oxygen service and rated for cylinder pressure. Avoid suck back of water, acid and alkalis. Do not breathe gas.

Safe handling of the gas cylinder	<ul> <li>Refer to supplier's cylinder handling instructions. Do not allow backfeed into the cylinder. Protect cylinders from physical damage; do not drag, roll, slide or drop. When moving cylinders, even for short distances, use a cart (trolley, hand truck, etc.) designed to transport cylinders. Leave valve protection caps in place until the cylinder has been secured against either a wall or bench or placed in a container stand and is ready for use. If user experiences any difficulty operating valve discontinue use and contact supplier. Never attempt to repair or modify cylinder valves or safety relief devices. Damaged valves should be reported immediately to the supplier. Keep cylinder valve outlets clean and free from contaminants particularly oil and water. Replace valve outlet caps or plugs and cylinder caps where supplied as soon as cylinder is disconnected from equipment.
